### Summer Food Service Program Feeds Kids for Free

Griffith Public Schools is participating in the Summer Food Service Program. Meals will be provided to all children 18 years of age or younger without charge regardless of race, color, national origin, sex, age or disability. Meals will be provided on a first-come, first-served basis, at the sites and times as follows:

**True Light Day Care – June 10<sup>th</sup> through August 8<sup>th</sup>**

Breakfast 7:00am – 7:30am / Lunch 11:00am – 11:30am

**YMCA Program – Griffith YMCA – June 10<sup>th</sup> through August 8<sup>th</sup>**

Breakfast 8:00am – 8:30am / Lunch 12:00pm – 12:30pm

**Ready Elementary School – June 10<sup>th</sup> through August 8<sup>th</sup> M-TH**

Breakfast 7:30am – 8:00am / Lunch 11:00am – 11:30pm

Each year, the U.S. Department of Agriculture partners with local organizations like Griffith Public Schools to provide free meals to children 18 years of age or younger when school is out for the summer.
